

Bases: "voc" & "voke"

A <u>root</u> is a word part that has a specific meaning. There are 3 kinds of roots:

prefix base suffix

A <u>prefix</u> is added to the front of a base.

A <u>base</u> is the main part of a word.

A <u>suffix</u> is added to the end of a base.



The base "mot" means "move" or "travel."


What word uses those two word parts and describes the act of moving someone forward to a higher rank or position?










The <u>root</u> "-ful" is a <u>suffix</u> that means "having or showing a lot of" or "full of." What "-ful" words describe the pictures?
