

USING THE PREFIX INTER-



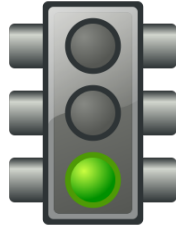
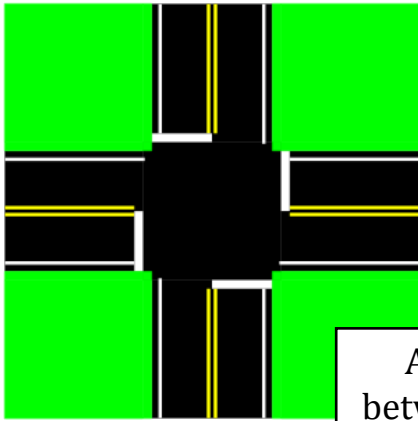
A **prefix** is a root that is added to the front of a base.

inter-

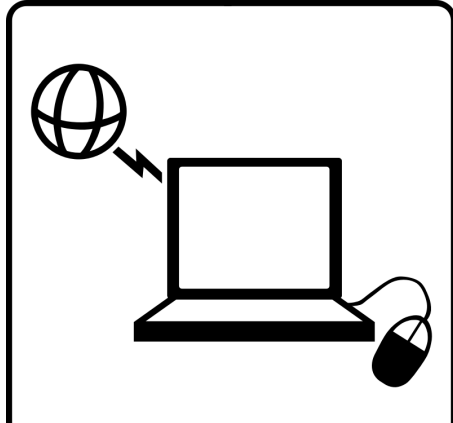
The prefix *inter-* is from the Latin and can mean “between” or “among.”



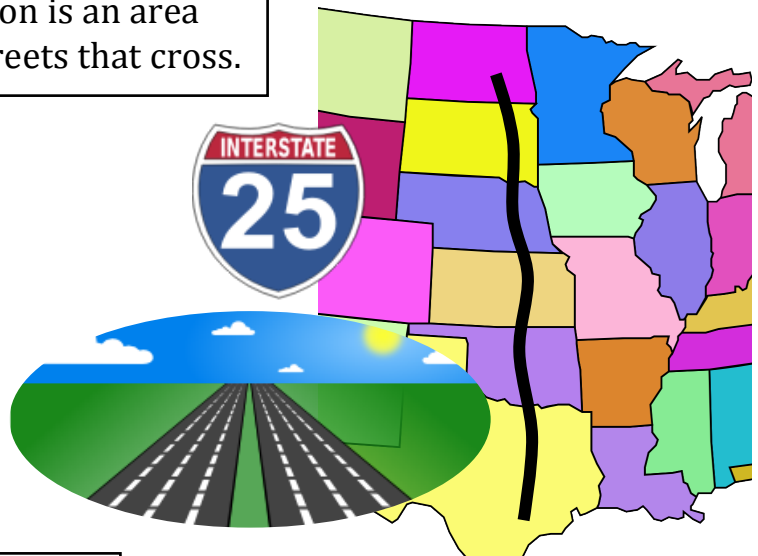
An **interview** is a series of questions and answers **between** two people.



An **intersection** is an area between two streets that cross.



The **internet** is the network that allows information to be transferred **between** and **among** different computers.



An **interstate** highway is a highway that travels **between** and through different states.

MORE EXAMPLES

intercept = to come **between** and block a moving object and its destination

interrupt = to break into a conversation, coming **between** two people that are talking

interpret = to provide communication **between** people who speak different languages

international = occurring **between** or **among** different nations of the world

interval = a space **between** objects or points; a period of time **between** two events
