


## USING THE PREFIX INTER-



A **prefix** is a root that is added to the front of a base.




The prefix *inter*- is from the Latin and can mean "between" or "among."





An **inter**view is a series of questions and answers **between** two people.

An **inter**section is an area between two streets that cross.





The **inter**net is the network that allows information to be transferred **between** and **among** different computers.

An **inter**state highway is a highway that travels **between** and through different states.

## **MORE EXAMPLES**

intercept = to come between and block a moving object and its destination
interrupt = to break into a conversation, coming between two people that are talking
interpret = to provide communication between people who speak different languages
international = occurring between or among different nations of the world
interval = a space between objects or points; a period of time between two events
