

USING THE PREFIX PER-



A **prefix** is a root that is added to the front of a base.

per-

The prefix *per*- is from the Latin and can mean "through" or "thoroughly"/"completely."




If someone is **per**plexed, they are **thoroughly** and completely confused.

When you **per**spire, you are sweating **through** your skin.




To **per**mit an action is to allow it, letting it "go **through**".





Percussion instruments, such as drums, are ones that you hit or strike to make sound come **through**.

If something is **per**forated, it has holes punched **through** it.



MORE EXAMPLES

persist = to stick with a task, pushing through difficulties and problems
persevere = to stick with a task, pushing through difficulties and problems
perfect - done thoroughly well, without any mistakes or flaws
perfume = a fragrance that drifts through the air
permanent = lasting forever, through all the years
perspective = point-of-view; the way you "look through your eyes" at a situation
