

Building Vocabulary

Prefix: "pro-"

A root is a word part that has a specific meaning. There are 3 kinds of roots:

> prefix base suffix

A prefix is added to the front of a base.

A base is the main part of a word.

A suffix is added to the end of a base.






Building Vocabulary Roots & Their Meanings

The <u>roots</u> "il-", "im-, and "in-" are <u>prefixes</u> that share the same meaning: "not or the opposite of."










The <u>prefix</u> "pro-" can mean "forward" or "for."

What "pro-" word literally means "to send forward" and means to pledge that you will do something in the future.








The <u>prefix</u> "com-" means "together" or "with."





The prefix "pro-" can mean "forward" or "for."




What "pro-" word describes the act of helping an idea, action, business move <u>forward</u> by encouraging positive feelings in others.
