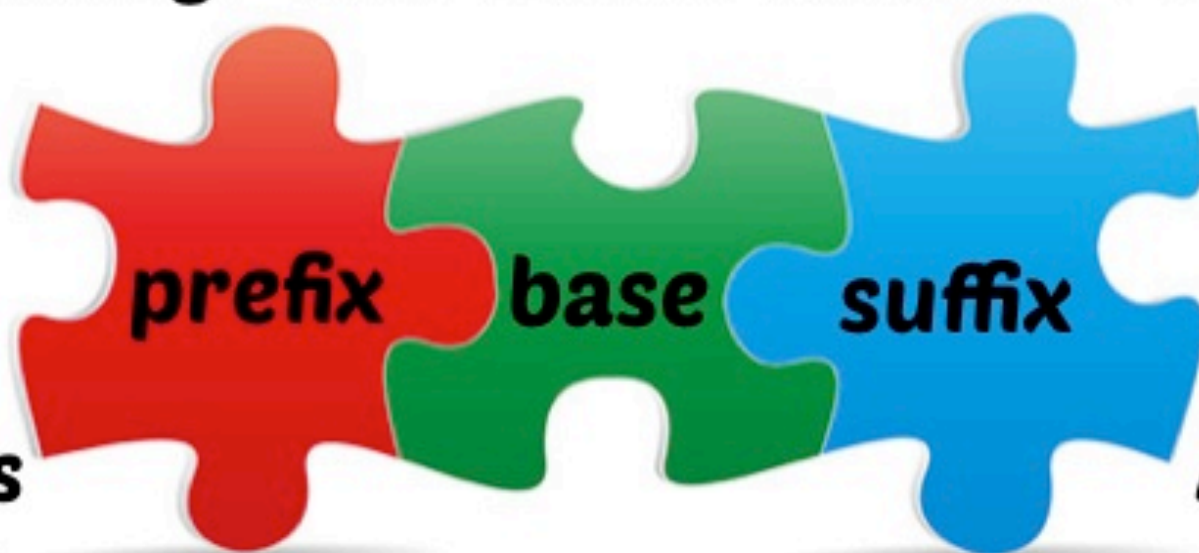




Building Vocabulary

A prefix is added to the front of a base.

A base is the main part of a word.

A suffix is added to the end of a base.

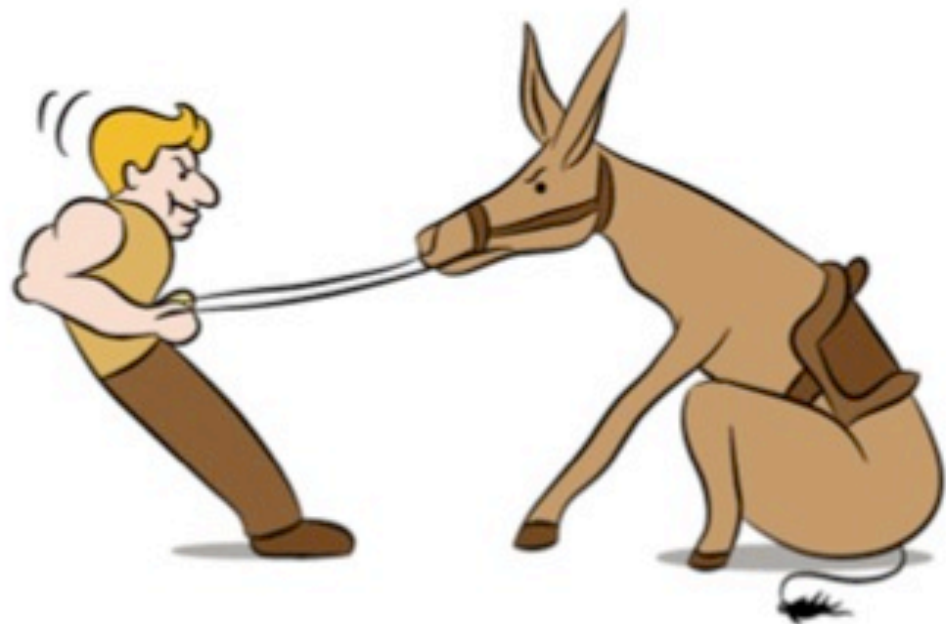

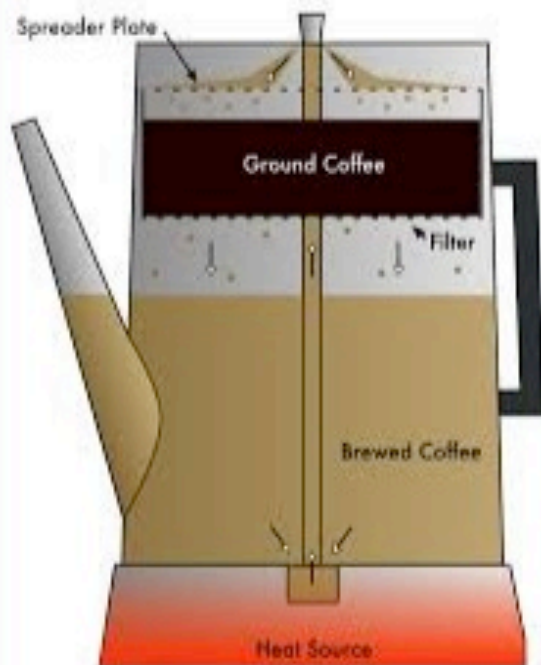
What word can mean stubborn or not able to be pulled in the direction that you want?

What “per-” word names a machine that pushes water through coffee grounds to make coffee?

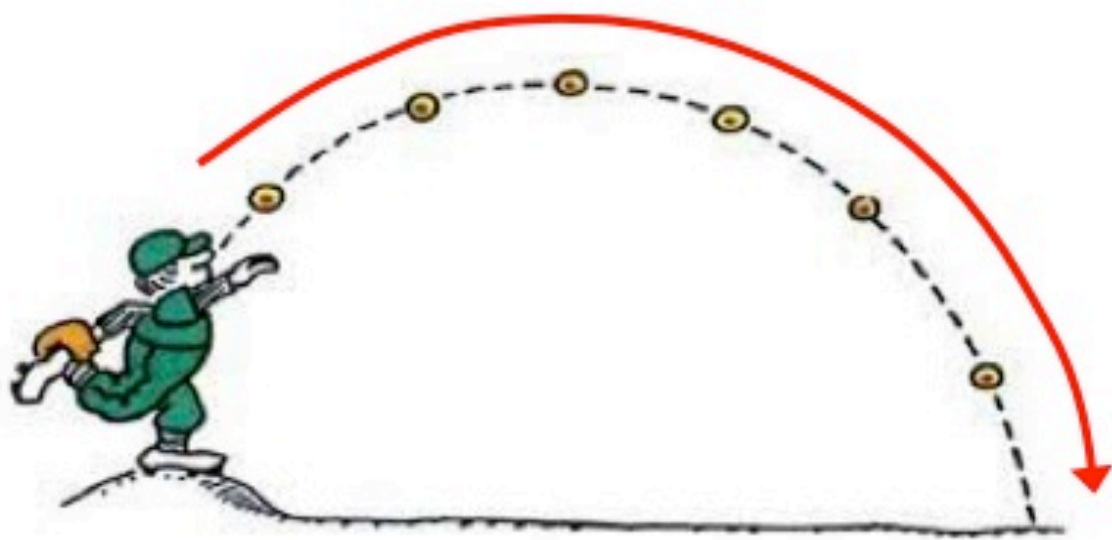

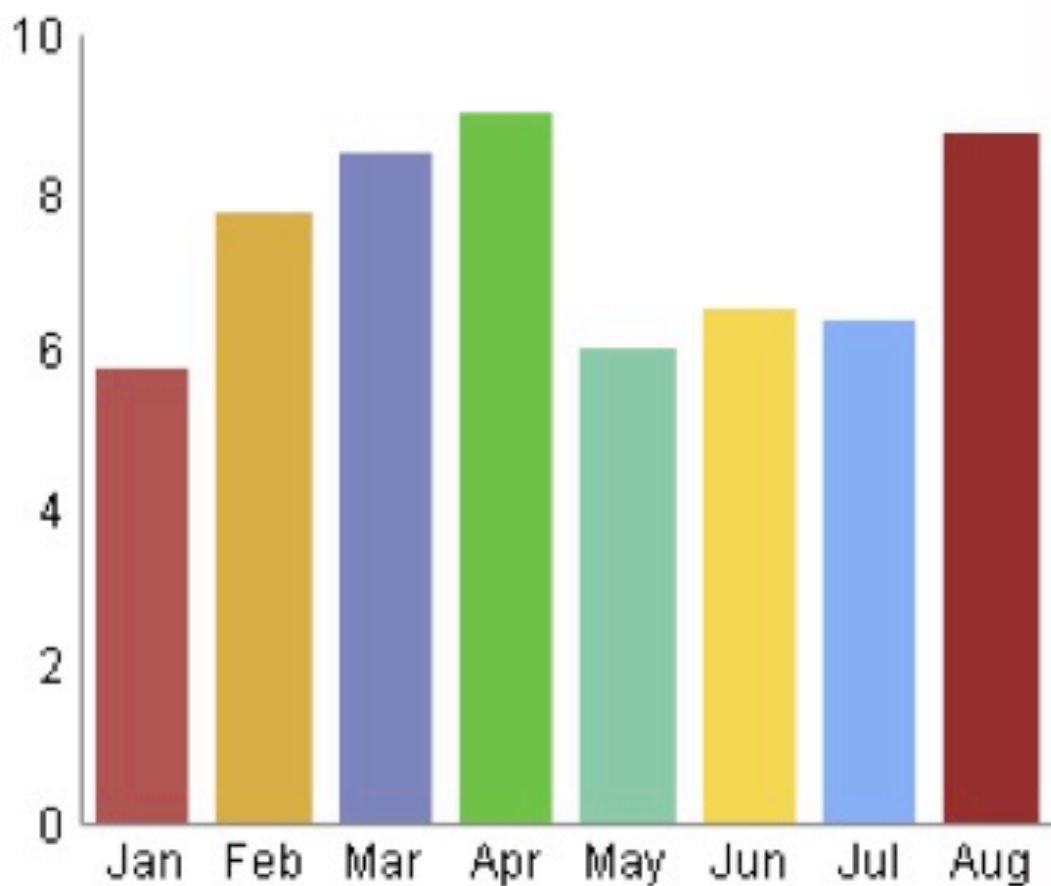
